EXCHANGE APPLICATION PROCESS

Exchange program application available in October
Nomination/Application Deadline Nov. 15, 2022
Acceptance Letter Sent Before Dec. 31, 2022
Arrival Date (no later than) Feb. 22, 2023
Semester Starts On Mar. 2, 2023
Semester Ends On Jun. 22, 2023
* Student must leave country within 1 month of last day of classes.

APPLICANT REQUIREMENT

1. Undergraduate student of partner university with at least 2 semesters completed at home university before applying
2. Minimum GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale

NATIONAL INSURANCE

All international students are required to join the national insurance. It is effective from the date of issuance of the Residence Card. Students may buy additional insurance from home country for the non-covered period or for the entire period.

APPLICATION

All original documents must arrive at SMU by the deadline – Nov. 15, 2022.

Home university coordinator must submit student nominations by email (student name and birthdate)

4. Certificate of enrollment at home university
5. Copy of passport ID page
6. Passport photo
7. Proof of language proficiency (if applicable)

 - TOEFL

HOUSING AND MEALS

International Student Housing costs (special rates apply for 2023 Spring entrants)

Cost per semester (from 1 week before beginning of classes to last day of class)

Single room:	KRW 616,000
Double room:	KRW 196,000
Triple room:	KRW 55,000
Quadruple room:	Free of charge

Facilities include: bed, desk, chair, closet, refrigerator, table, shared shoe rack, bathroom, laundry room

Bedding is not provided, utilities included

***Students are required to submit the tuberculosis test result (tested negative within 3 months) upon arrival at housing office

Meals

There is no meal plan but students may cook or use the on-campus cafeteria for lunch. The cafeteria is closed for dinner currently due to COVID19, but this may change. On campus meals cost roughly KRW 6,000.

There are a few restaurants near campus.

BUDDY PROGRAM

It is recommended that all international students participate in the Buddy Program. Buddy Program consists of Korean SMU students (single or group) that help out international students and participate in joint activities throughout the semester.

UNDERGRADUATE COURSES

Students may either choose either Korean (courses taught in Korean) or K-Wave (courses taught in English) program.

Most courses in the departments listed below are taught in Korean, with very limited courses offered in English. Students with TOPIK 4/5 will have no problem taking the courses. It is strongly recommended that students have at least TOPIK 3 for taking courses offered in Korean.

The K-Wave program is offered in English, except for the Korean language learning course.

Students may take up to 17 credits per semester.
